## Information on Resuming KidsCrossing

### Before Arriving at Church

- **Make a RESERVATION.** Reservations are required for seats in the auditorium **AND** attending KidsCrossing. We know, it's a slight inconvenience, but it ensures we're adhering to guidelines for building capacities, social distancing and other safety measures.  
**Reservations go live at noon on Mondays** - get yours before they're gone!
  - Go to The Crossing's webpage and at the very top of the screen you'll see a link to RESERVE SPACE. You'll need to fill this form out for anyone that will be attending church in the auditorium – **DO NOT include any kids that will be going to KidsCrossing in your count. There is a separate sign-up for kids.**
  - After you've made your auditorium reservations there will be a link for you to click that will take you to a Sign-Up Genius page where you can make reservations for your kid(s).
    - **We encourage you to register early** as there are a limited number of spots in each room and once full, we will not be able to take any more reservations. The same is true for reserving a space in the auditorium.
- If you have never visited one of our sites in person, please go to our new [family\\_pre-registration](#) page to expedite the check-in process when you arrive.
- Make sure to do a wellness check before you leave. If anyone in your family has a fever or is exhibiting any known symptoms of COVID -19 (or any other contagious diseases) please keep that person at home.

### Upon Arriving at Church

- **Arrive 20 minutes before service.**
- Please have your **Sign-Up Genius confirmation email** pulled up on your mobile device as this is how we will verify your reservation in kids ministry.
- We will take temperatures of all kids prior to checking them into their room.
- A staff member or volunteer will print nametags for your family in effort to keep things as contactless as possible.
- We will have social distancing markers on the floor, and we ask that you please, for the safety of all families, keep your distance when standing in line or waiting in the lobby.
